# Scouting for barbecue

If you have a craving for barbecue, don't stop at the Sonny's Real Pit Bar-B-Q in DeLand. The restaurant, which suffered extensive damage in last Friday's twister outbreak, is not reopening. A spokeswoman for Sonny's said the DeLand restaurant was closed because the franchisee chose not to renew a license agreement, which expired on Sunday, just two days after the tornado struck. Sonny's is now scouting for a new site for a restaurant in the DeLand area, the company said.

# Battle of the banks

Colonial Bank is talking about an aggressive expansion in Orange County that could help it capture more market share from SunTrust, the region's largest bank. But this "battle of the banks" has an interesting twist. In recent years, Colonial has been gaining ground in Orange County -- SunTrust's "backyard" -- but SunTrust is also gaining in Lake County, which has been Colonial's stronghold since 2005. That's when it acquired First Federal Savings Bank of Lake County. The latest deposit data in Lake indicates Colonial leads SunTrust by less than one-third of a percentage point.


### Closed for renovations

Callers to the restaurant were directed to the Market Street Cafe in Celebration, which remains open. Both restaurants were developed by Orlando-based Restaurant Partners, a consulting company.
